Becoming Age-Friendly

Tufts Health Plan Foundation Awards Over \$50,000 To Sustainable SNHPC Foundation for Age-Friendly Pilots

SNHPC has completed Phase I of the Becoming Age-Friendly program, which included surveying residents and assessing all 14 communities in the SNHPC region on age-friendly characteristics, including transportation, housing, recreation & engagement, and business & economic development. A report of findings from Phase I will be shared with communities on August 11th.

With committed funds for Phase II, SNHPC will host a stakeholder committee meeting (date TBD) and establish criteria for selecting three municipalities in the region to implement an age-friendly action plan. Stay tuned!

Plan NH: MTAG Grant Opportunity

September 29, 2017 - Grant Applications are due.

Plan NH is pleased to announce the Municipal Technical Assistance Grant (MTAG) Program will continue in 2018.

Grant amounts may be no less than \$5000.00, and no more than \$20,000.00. Applications for the next round of funding are due September 29, 2017. Selections will be made in October.

The program is for New Hampshire communities that want to expand options for places to live (i.e. by location and/or design) and need to change their zoning regulations in order to do so. For example, the community may want places to live in the town center, but current zoning does not allow it. Or people may be looking for denser neighborhoods of smaller homes, but current zoning does not allow it.

Grant funds are for hiring consultants to review current regulations and re-writing what's there and/or creating new regulations to address the wants and needs of the community's members regarding housing choices.

A 25% cash match is required. The timing of the process allows for those communities that need to go to Town Meeting in 2018 for the cash match.

A key part of the program is community outreach and engagement in the process.

Updated information and application materials will be available on the Plan NH website the first week of August. Meanwhile, interested community members may review the 2017 information here:

In 2016, the towns of Boscawen, Franconia, Hinsdale and Peterborough were selected. Currently, the towns of Candia and Rochester are just getting under way.

Southern NH Planning Commission

The SNHPC region includes the City of Manchester and the towns of Auburn, Bedford, Candia, Chester, Deerfield, Derry, Frankestown, Goffstown, Hooksett, Londonderry, New Boston, Weare and Windham. The main functions of SNHPC are to increase communication; promote intergovernmental cooperation and coordination between planning boards and local officials; promote coordinated development of the region; prepare and adopt regional plans, including policies and strategies for the region; and perform other acts or functions as deemed appropriate to fulfill its duties.

SNHPC is governed by a Board of Commissioners, 48 local representatives from our 14 member communities. The Commissioners are appointed by the governing bodies of the member municipalities upon the recommendation of their respective planning boards, as outlined in RSA 36:46. An Executive Committee, consisting of 14 commissioners, is elected from the membership of the full Board of Commissioners to provide overall policy direction and guidance, and to administer the Commission's financial and operational affairs. An Executive Director is appointed by the Commission to manage and supervise the day-to-day operations of the Commission and its staff under the general direction provided by the Executive Committee and the Board of Commissioners.
