## Diesel Emissions Reductions Act Grants

The EPA has released the 2017 Request for Proposals for the Diesel Emissions Reductions Act (DERA) Clean Diesel Assistance Program. This grant program seeks to reduce diesel emissions through a variety of activities, including engine modifications and vehicle and engine replacements.

Projects can be reimbursed for 25 percent to 100 percent of the project cost. Eligible projects include replacement of diesel vehicles/engines in on-road trucks, buses, trains, marine vessels, construction equipment, non-road vehicles and generators. The maximum amount of Federal funds that can be requested per proposal is \$950,000. **Proposals are due not later than Tuesday, June 20, 2017** at 11:59 PM Eastern Time to be considered for funding. NHDES is available to assist with the development of applications for these competitive federal funds.

NHDES will also have some limited DERA funding (approximately

## Southern NH Planning Commission

The SNHPC region includes the City of Manchester and the towns of Auburn, Bedford, Candia, Chester, Deerfield, Derry, Frankestown, Goffstown, Hooksett, Londonderry, New Boston, Weare and Windham. The main functions of SNHPC are to increase communication; promote intergovernmental cooperation and coordination between planning boards and local officials; promote coordinated development of the region; prepare and adopt regional plans, including policies and strategies for the region; and perform other acts or functions as deemed appropriate to fulfill its duties.

SNHPC is governed by a Board of Commissioners, 48 local representatives from our 14 member communities. The Commissioners are appointed by the governing bodies of the member municipalities upon the recommendation of their respective planning boards, as outlined in RSA 36:46. An Executive Committee, consisting of 14 commissioners, is elected from the membership of the full Board of Commissioners to provide overall policy direction and guidance, and to administer the Commission's financial and operational affairs. An Executive Director is appointed by the Commission to manage and supervise the day-to-day operations of the Commission and its staff under the general direction provided by the Executive Committee and the Board of Commissioners.
