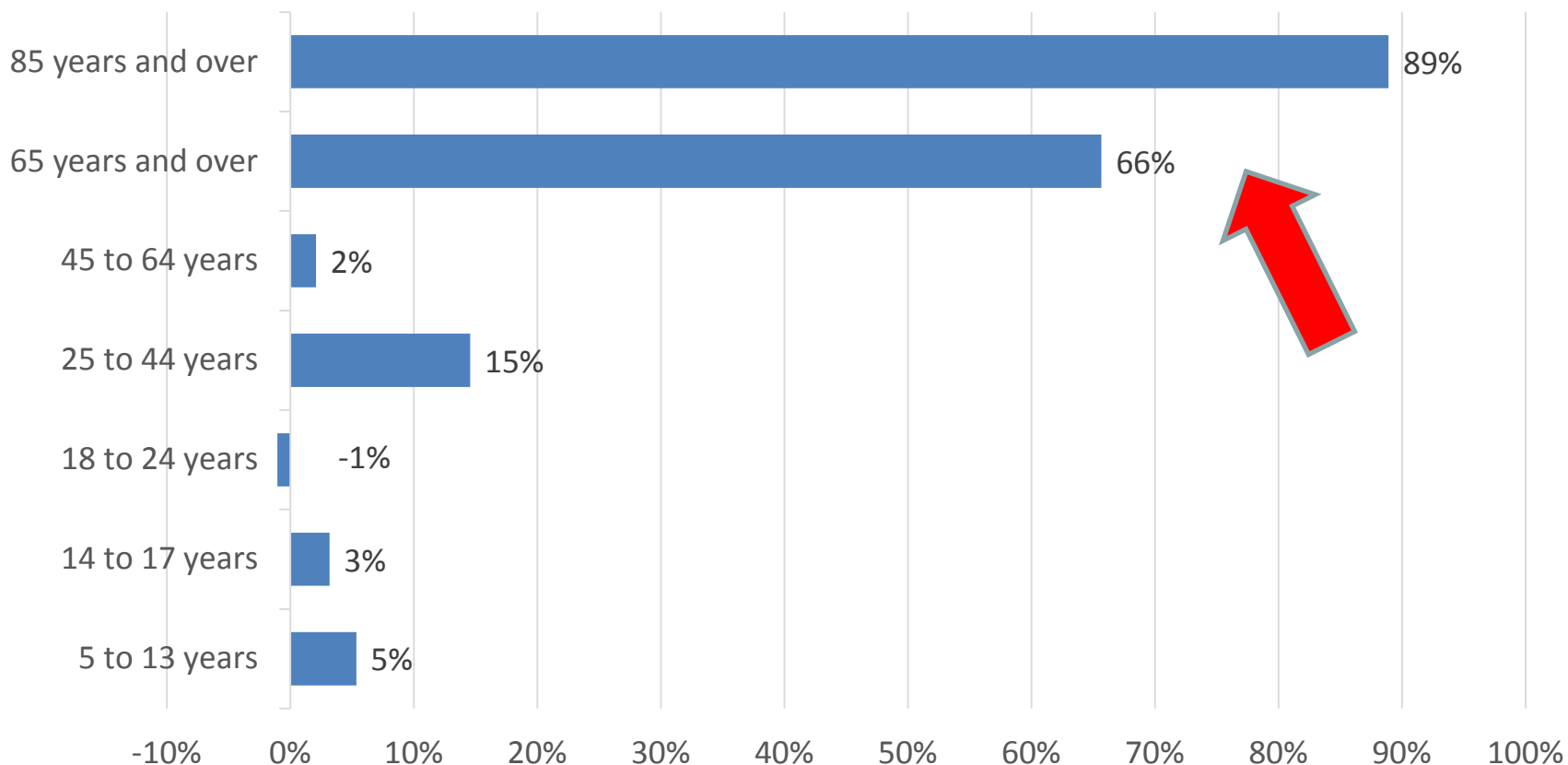

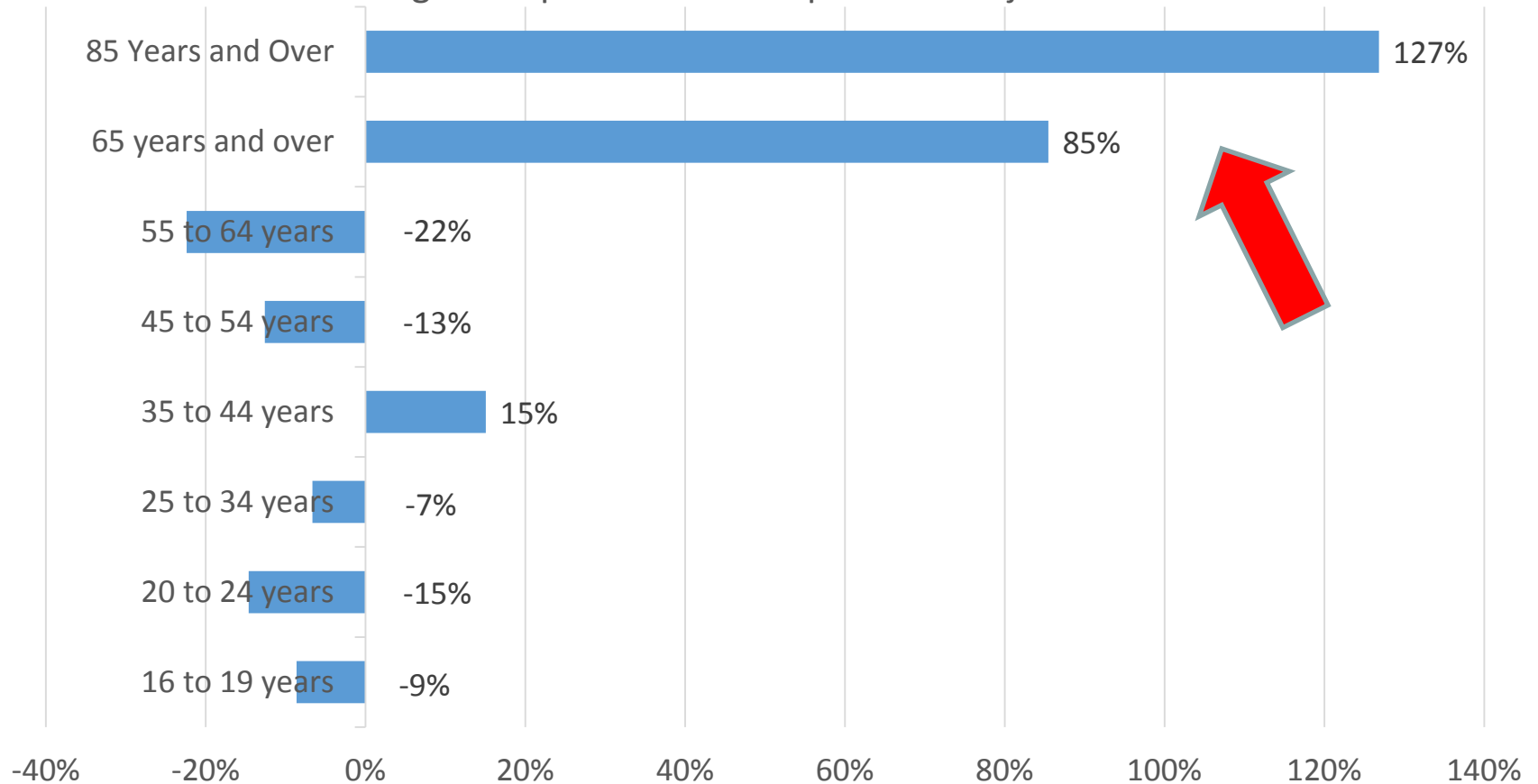
Population Projections: Aging Is Everywhere

Percent Change in Population: National Projections 2015-2035



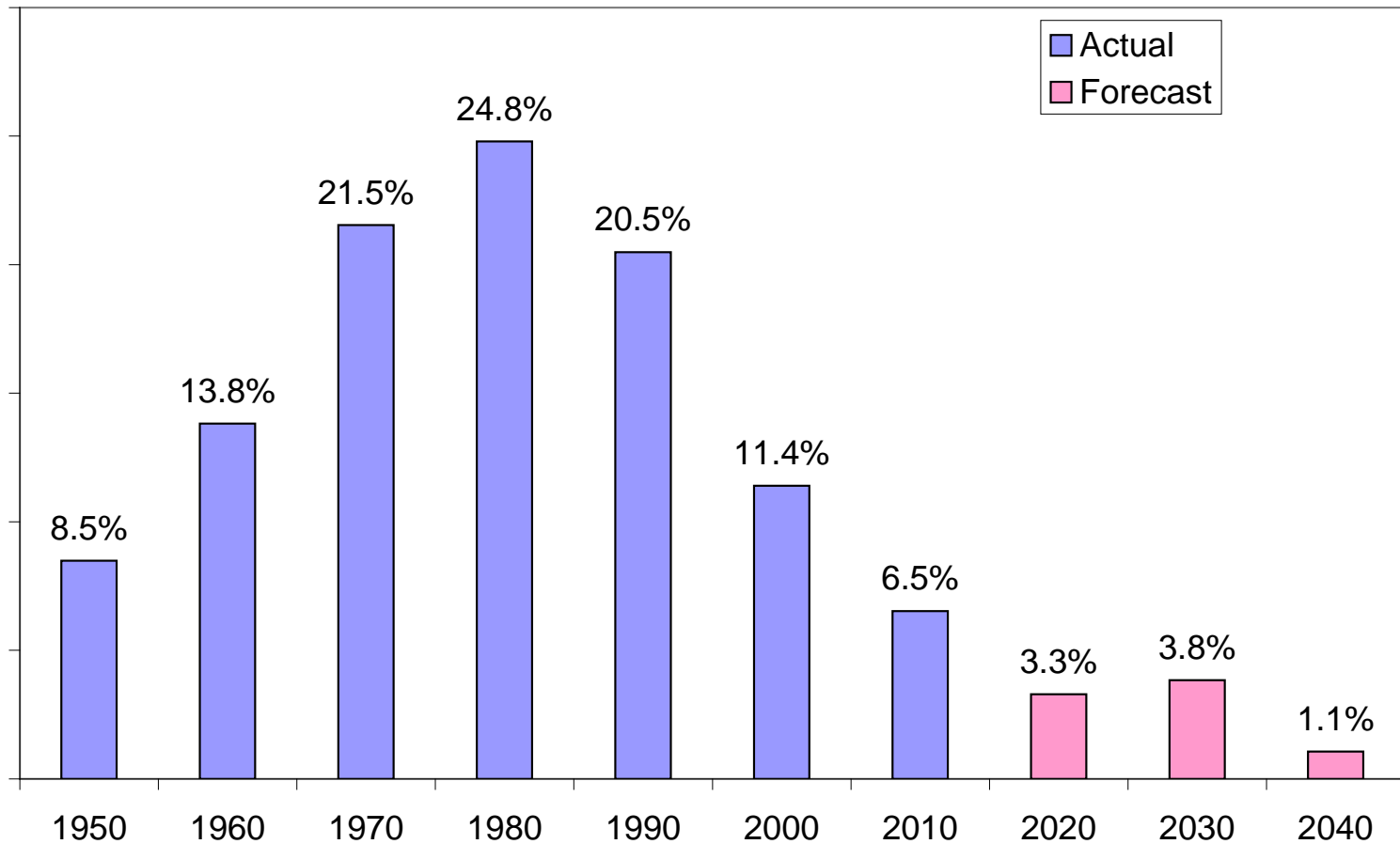
But more so in NH

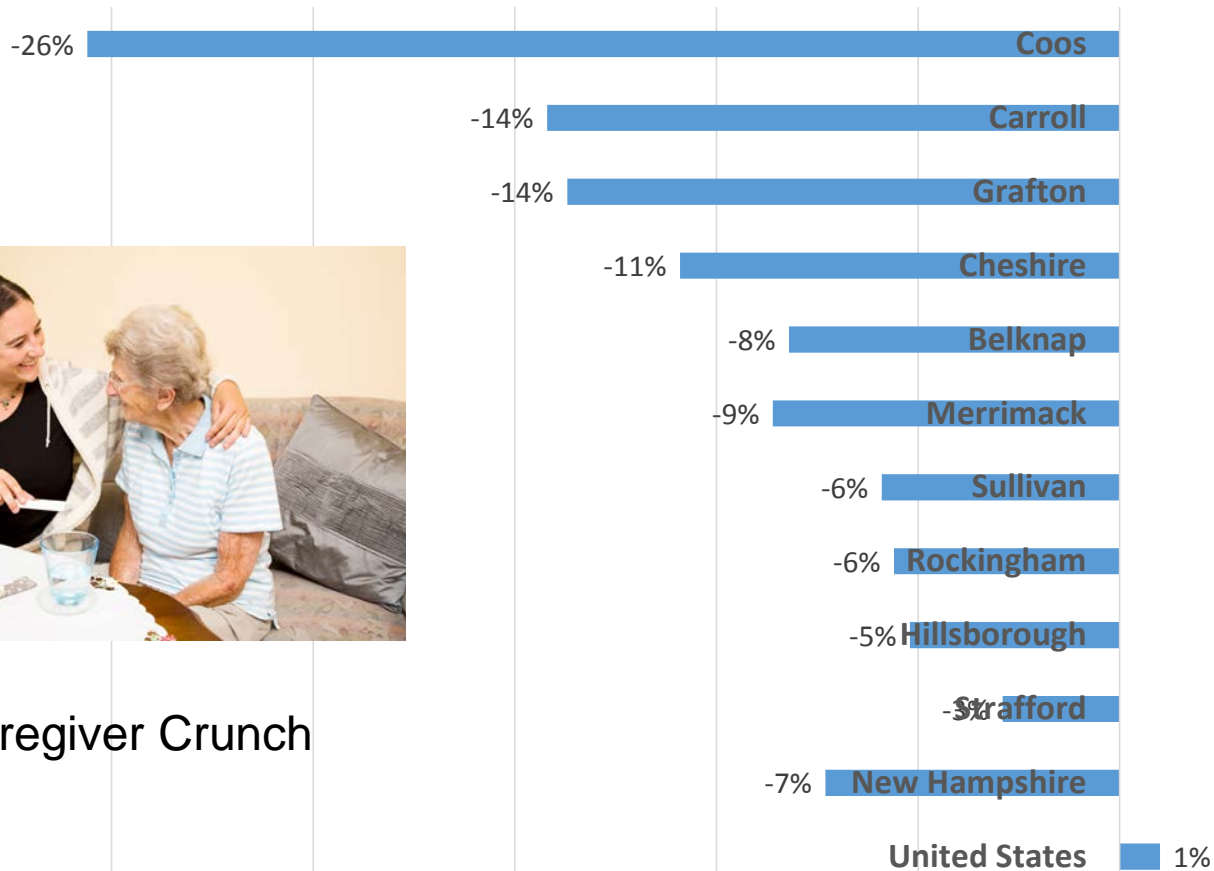
