This annual report outlines the annual accomplishments and goals of the Southern New Hampshire Planning Commission (SNHPC) Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) with regard to its compliance with Title VI regulations. This report covers accomplishments for the period from July 1, 2020, to June 30, 2021, and the goals SNHPC aims to achieve for the period from July 1, 2021, to June 30, 2022.

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SNHPC Title VI Policy Statement

It is the policy of the Southern New Hampshire Planning Commission (SNHPC) Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) to effectuate Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended, the Civil Rights Restoration Act of 1987, and related statutes and regulations in all Federal programs and activities. Pursuant to this obligation, no person shall, on the grounds of race, color, or national origin be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or otherwise be subjected to discrimination in any program or activity carried out by the SNHPC. The SNHPC will also monitor and enforce statutory requirements imposed on its sub-recipients and participants of Federally-assisted programs and projects. The SNHPC further assures that every effort will be made to ensure nondiscrimination in all of its programs and operations, regardless of funding source.

The SNHPC MPO operates without regard to race, color, or national origin. SNHPC MPO meetings are held in accessible locations, and reasonable accommodations are made for individuals with disabilities upon request within a reasonable advance notice period. Title VI Annual Assurances

The SNHPC, in its capacity as the region's MPO, receives federal financial assistance from the U.S. Department of Transportation (USDOT), through the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and the Federal Transit Administration (FTA). As such, the MPO is subject to and complies with Standard Title VI/Nondiscrimination Assurances, including those defined in <u>US DOT Order No.: 1050.2A</u>. As part of this responsibility, the SNHPC maintains up-to-date Title VI assurances. A copy of the SNHPC's assurances are provided in "<u>Appendix B: Title VI Annual Assurances to DOT"</u> and "<u>Appendix C: FTA Annual Certifications and Assurances</u>" of this annual report.

Title VI Coordinator




Figure 1: MPO Organizational Chart

The SNHPC Office Administrator is the designated Title VI Coordinator for the MPO. The MPO's Organizational Chart, highlighting this position, is shown in Figure 1. The MPO's Title VI Coordinator is responsible for prompt processing of all Title VI discrimination complaints submitted to the MPO.

Additional responsibilities of the Title VI Coordinator include:

- Assisting MPO staff in correcting Title VI problems or potentially discriminatory practices or policies found through self-monitoring and review activities.
- Implementing procedures for the prompt processing of Title VI discrimination complaints.
- Documenting attendance at training on Title VI/Non-Discrimination subject matter.

Title VI Implementation & Annual Reporting

Title VI Annual Work Plan

To aid in implementation of the Southern New Hampshire Planning Commission Title VI/Non-Discrimination Program goals, the SNHPC has developed an Annual Work Plan. The Annual Work Plan organizes and coordinates tasks into a scheduled framework. Tasks are selected based upon the previous year's accomplishments, newly identified needs, and State and Federal guidance for adherence to Title VI/Non-Discrimination responsibilities. The Annual Work Plan is included in "Appendix A: Title VI Annual Work Plan" of this Goals and Accomplishments Report.

This Goals and Accomplishments Report for FY 2021 informs the New Hampshire Department of Transportation (NHDOT) Office Federal Compliance and federal partner agencies on the implementation of the MPO's Title VI/Non-Discrimination Plan. In accordance 23 CFR 200, this report documents the SNHPC MPO's Title VI program accomplishments for the past fiscal year. In addition, Figure 2 illustrates the MPO Title VI/Non-Discrimination Plan process – demonstrating the relationship between the Title VI Plan, and the subsequent Work Plan and the Accomplishments Report.

Informing the Public of the MPO Planning Process

The SNHPC follows the public involvement process outlined in the SNHPC MPO's <u>Public Participation Plan</u> (PPP), for all plan and program development including the Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP), the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) and the Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP), to ensure that Title VI populations are effectively participating in the development process of transportation planning documents.

The MPO uses the following tools for implementation of the PPP:

- The MPO's website (https://www.snhpc.org/);
- Contacts Database (Including a Title VI Stakeholders list);
- Social Media via Facebook Page, Twitter Handle, Eventbrite Account, and YouTube Channel;
- GIS Online Portals (Linked on the SNHPC webpage);
- SNHPC Electronic Newsletters (AKA the SNHPC Sustainable Newsflash); and
- Local Newspaper Public Notices & Display Ads.

Other media include articles in community newsletters, taking part in local radio talk shows, local television news coverage, cross promotion outreach with our member municipalities and partner agencies. The MPO conducts monthly public meetings and public hearings as needed to maintain the UPWP, TIP, MTP, and other metropolitan planning documents. SNHPC staff takes attendance at these public meetings which are used to identify what communities were represented at meetings and hearings. By extension, the MPO utilizes these same tools to reach out to Title VI communities within the region.

Title VI Goals and Accomplishments

Fiscal Year 2021 Title VI Accomplishments

The SNHPC's previous (FY 2020) Title VI Goals and Accomplishments Report identified the following goals for FY 2021:

Title VI Goal 2021.A Accomplishments:

"Ensure the level and quality of transportation service is provided without regard to race, color, or national origin."

- Measure: Adoption of an updated Title VI/Non-Discrimination Plan.
 - In August of 2020, SNHPC's MPO Policy Committee adopted an update to the Title VI/Non-Discrimination Plan for the MPO. The adoption of an updated plan was preceded by and followed-up with a consultant recommendation (RLS & Associates working on behalf of the NHDOT Bureau of Rail and Transit) which resulted in the following actions:
 - Incorporation of Title VI Public Notice Language in both English and Spanish.
 - Addition of FTA as an additional direct point of contact in the Policy Statement, Public Notice Language, and in the Procedures/Form for filing Title VI complaints.
 - Addition of a formatted table of filed complaints, investigations, and lawsuits.
 - Inclusion of an updated demographic profile for the SNHPC region, using 2014-2018
 American Community Survey (ACS) data.
 - SNHPC staff also provided technical assistance and demographic data to Easter Seals, a regional FTA Section 5310 funding subrecipient, for their Title VI/Non-Discrimination Plan update which was adopted during FY 2021.

Title VI Goal 2021.B Accomplishments:

"To identify and address, as appropriate, disproportionally high, and adverse human health and environmental effects, including social and economic effects of programs and activities on minority populations and low-income populations."

- Measure: SNHPC staff participation in low-income and/or minority-led meetings.
 - O In the reporting period, five SNHPC staff members spent 48 hours participating in two community action groups led by persons of color. The community action groups are both focused on serving census tracts with a high concentration of both low-income households and minority populations. Meetings of the Manchester Environmental Justice Advisory Committee focused on addressing issues of equitable access to safe streets for pedestrians through sidewalk and bicycle infrastructure. SNHPC participation in the Manchester Community Action Coalition focused on outlining the transportation planning process and the role MPO members play in the transportation planning decision-making process.

Title VI Goal 2021.C Accomplishments:

"To promote the full and fair participation of all affected populations in transportation decision-making."

- Measure: SNHPC content creation and facilitation of transportation outreach.
 - The SNHPC, in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, has incorporated new procedures for public outreach and participation. These new outreach procedures created new opportunities for Virtual Public Involvement (VPI) for the general public. SNHPC staff established online portals via Facebook and Eventbrite in which the public can virtually attend SNHPC TAC and MPO meetings. In addition to virtual live attendance at TAC and MPO meeting, the general public can now watch past meetings via SNHPC's YouTube channel.
 - O In the reporting period, nine SNHPC staff members spent a cumulative 103 hours reviewing, finalizing, and conducting outreach for an updated Public Participation Plan (PPP). Staff outreach activities included defining audiences and persons served as well as staff presentation of the Draft PPP and public posting of the Draft PPP for a 45-day review and comment period. Accomplishments after MPO adoption of the PPP included identification of measures for tracking and the development of a dashboard for tracking implementation.

Title VI Goal 2021.D Accomplishments:

"To prevent the denial, reduction or delay in benefits related to programs and activities that benefit minority populations or low-income populations."

- Measure: MPO maintenance of the transportation planning process to ensure access to benefits.
 - As part of the MPO's regular updates to the MTP and TIP, revisions were made to the criteria
 that the SNHPC uses to prioritize projects. Table 8 of the recently adopted MTP cites the
 TIP's prioritization criteria which now includes weightings for both equity (4.26% of score)
 and accessibility (7.44% of score). Together, these two criteria provide weighting of 11.7%
 for projects that provide benefits to traditionally underserved populations.
 - O During FY 2021, SNHPC participated in a statewide Transportation Alternatives Process (TAP) project solicitation. The TAP evaluation criteria for the SNHPC region includes an additional criterion for socioeconomic benefits to the region. The socioeconomic benefits criterion evaluates the degree to which the proposed TAP project provides opportunities to enhance the quality of life and provide transportation options for traditionally underserved communities. The weighting for the socioeconomic benefits criterion is 7% and is used to help prioritize the use of TAP funds to benefit the region's Title VI's populations.
 - As part of SNHPC's oversight of FTA funding subrecipients, SNHPC staff reviewed the Title VI/Non-Discrimination plans for four transit service providers in the region MTA, Easter Seals, Rockingham Nutrition Meals on Wheels, and Caregivers. All four subrecipients completed and adopted updates to their Title VI/Non-Discrimination plans during FY 2021.

Title VI Goal 2021.E Accomplishments:

"To ensure meaningful access to programs and activities by persons with limited English proficiency."

- Measure: Updates to the Limited English Proficiency (LEP) content and four-factor analysis in the SNHPC Title VI/Non-Discrimination Plan.
 - Section 3.8 of the SNHPC Title VI/Non-Discrimination Plan provides an updated four-factor analysis as well as demographic data analysis based on the 2014-2018 ACS. Data for the SNHPC region was included in the August 2020 update of the Title VI/Non-Discrimination Plan, as noted in Goal 2022.A. As part of this effort, the SNHPC developed updated strategies for implementation of language assistance for Spanish speaking populations within the region.
 - The SNHPC has started work on a stand-alone Language Assistance Plan (LAP) as per the recommendations of NHDOT's consultant RLS & Associates. In the reporting period, six SNHPC staff members spent a cumulative 54 hours on the development of a draft stand-alone LAP. As part of this process, SNHPC staff again updated regional demographic information to reflect the 2015-2019 ACS data. The demographic analysis identifies LEP concentrations and safe-harbor languages. SNHPC staff also updated a stakeholder contact list to help inform the level of language accommodation appropriate for the MPO's primary documents and core transportation planning responsibilities.

Fiscal Year 2022 Title VI Goals

SNHPC recognizes the need to implement data collection strategies and measures in order to ensure Title VI integration into the transportation planning and decision-making process. To improve that integration, the planning commission has revised the Title VI goals for FY 2022, identified below in Table 2, to better measure and report accomplishments.

 limited to, Manchester Environmental Justice Advisory Committee and Manchester Community
 Action Coalition.
 - o Metric 1: SNHPC attendance at events organized for or by Minority, and LEP communities.
 - Metric 2: Completion of an updated contact list of Title VI stakeholders to receive communications and public notices for MPO transportation planning process materials.

- Goal 2022.C: Develop a Spanish translated informational brochure on the MPO planning process.
 - o Metric 1: Completion of a formatted MPO brochure in English and Spanish.
 - Metric 2: List of locations where the translated brochure was distributed/posted.
- Goal 2022.D: Produce a Spanish translated SNHPC Commissioner Introductory Guide defining the roles and responsibilities of the MPO Policy Committee and its members and distribute the document to Title VI stakeholders.
 - Metric 1: Completion of a translated SNHPC guide on the roles and responsibilities of the MPO Policy Committee and its members.
 - o Metric 2: List of the places and organizations where the SNHPC guide was distributed.
- Goal 2022.E: Finalize and adopt a stand-alone Language Assistance Plan (LAP).
 - o Metric 1: Completion of stand-alone Language Assistance Plan.
 - Metric 2: MPO adoption of the stand-alone LAP following public notice, comment period, and hearing.
- Goal 2022.F: Conduct annual training of SNHPC staff on Title VI/Non-Discrimination subject matter.
 - o Metric: List of Title VI/LEP/Civil Rights trainings attended by SNPHC staff.

Corrective Actions from 2021 MPO Planning Review

The findings from the May 2021 FHWA/FTA MPO Planning Review state that:

"The MPO's Title VI Accomplishment Report must discuss whether identified goals were achieved for the MPO and/or sub recipient. This correction must be completed before the next reporting period."

With the submission of this Title VI Goals and Accomplishments Report, which includes clear and measurable goals along with metrics-based reporting of Title VI accomplishments, the MPO believes the aforementioned Corrective Action has been satisfied.

Appendix B: USDOT Title VI/Non-Discrimination Annual Assurances

The United States Department of Transportation (USDOT) Standard Title VI/Non-Discrimination Assurances DOT Order No. 1050.2A

The Southern New Hampshire Planning Commission (SNHPC) Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) (herein referred to as the "Recipient"), **HEREBY AGREES THAT**, as a condition to receiving any Federal financial assistance from the U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT), through Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), is subject to and will comply with the following:

Statutory/Regulatory Authorities

- Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (42 U.S.C. § 2000d et seq., 78 stat. 252), (prohibits discrimination on the basis of race, color, national origin);
- 49 C.F.R. Part 21 (entitled Non-discrimination In Federally-Assisted Programs Of The Department Of Transportation-Effectuation Of Title VI Of The Civil Rights Act Of 1964);
- 28 C.F.R. section 50.3 (U.S. Department of Justice Guidelines for Enforcement of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964);

The preceding statutory and regulatory cites hereinafter are referred to as the "Acts" and "Regulations," respectively.

General Assurances

In accordance with the Acts, the Regulations, and other pertinent directives, circulars, policy, memoranda, and/or guidance, the Recipient hereby gives assurance that it will promptly take any measures necessary to ensure that:

"No person in the United States shall, on the grounds of race, color, or national origin, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination under any program or activity, "for which the Recipient receives Federal financial assistance from DOT, including the FHWA".

The Civil Rights Restoration Act of 1987 clarified the original intent of Congress, with respect to Title VI and other Non-discrimination requirements (The Age Discrimination Act of 1975, and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973), by restoring the broad, institutional-wide scope and coverage of these non-discrimination statutes and requirements to include all programs and activities of the Recipient, so long as any portion of the program is Federally assisted.

Specific Assurances

More specifically, and without limiting the above general Assurance, the Recipient agrees with and gives the following Assurances with respect to its Federally assisted Highway Program:

1. The Recipient agrees that each "activity," "facility," or "program," as defined in §§ 21.23(b) and 21.23(e) of 49 C.F.R. § 21 will be (with regard to an "activity") facilitated, or will be (with regard

- to a "facility") operated, or will be (with regard to a "program") conducted in compliance with all requirements imposed by, or pursuant to the Acts and the Regulations.
- 2. The Recipient will insert the following notification in all solicitations for bids, Requests For Proposals for work, or material subject to the Acts and the Regulations made in connection with all Federal-Aid Highway Program activities and, in adapted form, in all proposals for negotiated agreements regardless of funding source:

"The Southern New Hampshire Planning Commission, in accordance with the provisions of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (78 Stat. 252, 42 US.C. §§ 2000d to 2000d-4) and the Regulations, hereby notifies all bidders that it will affirmatively ensure that any contract entered into pursuant to this advertisement, disadvantaged business enterprises will be afforded full and fair opportunity to submit bids in response to this invitation and will not be discriminated against on the grounds of race, color, or national origin in consideration for an award."

- 3. The Recipient will insert the clauses of Appendix A and E of this Assurance in every contract or agreement subject to the Acts and the Regulations.
- 4. The Recipient will insert the clauses of Appendix B of this Assurance, as a covenant running with the land, in any deed from the United States effecting or recording a transfer of real property, structures, use, or improvements thereon or interest therein to a Recipient.
- That where the Recipient receives Federal financial assistance to construct a facility, or part of a
 facility, the Assurance will extend to the entire facility and facilities operated in connection
 therewith.
- That where the Recipient receives Federal financial assistance in the form, or for the acquisition of real property or an interest in real property, the Assurance will extend to rights to space on, over, or under such property.
- 7. That the Recipient will include the clauses set forth in Appendix C and Appendix D of this Assurance, as a covenant running with the land, in any future deeds, leases, licenses, permits, or similar instruments entered into by the Recipient with other parties:
 - a. for the subsequent transfer of real property acquired or improved under the applicable activity, project, or program; and
 - b. for the construction or use of, or access to, space on, over, or under real property acquired or improved under the applicable activity, project, or program.
- 8. That this Assurance obligates the Recipient for the period during which Federal financial assistance is extended to the program, except where the Federal financial assistance is to provide, or is in the form of, personal property, or real property, or interest therein, or structures or improvements thereon, in which case the Assurance obligates the Recipient, or any transferee for the longer of the following periods:

- the period during which the property is used for a purpose for which the Federal financial assistance is extended, or for another purpose involving the provision of similar services or benefits; or
- b. the period during which the Recipient retains ownership or possession of the property.
- 9. The Recipient will provide for such methods of administration for the program as are found by the Secretary of Transportation or the official to whom he/she delegates specific authority to give reasonable guarantee that it, other recipients, sub-recipients, sub-grantees, contractors, subcontractors, consultants, transferees, successors in interest, and other participants of Federal financial assistance under such program will comply with all requirements imposed or pursuant to the Acts, the Regulations, and this Assurance.
- 10. The Recipient agrees that the United States has a right to seek judicial enforcement with regard to any matter arising under the Acts, the Regulations, and this Assurance.

 - (3) Using forced labor in the performance of the award or subawards under the award.

1.2. Standard Assurances: Additional Assurances for Construction Projects.

This certification appears on the Office of Management and Budget's standardform 424D "Assurances-Construction Programs" and applies specifically to federally assisted projects for construction. This certification has been modified in places to include analogous certifications required by U.S. DOT statutes or regulations.

As the duly authorized representative of the applicant, you certify that the applicant:

- (a) Will not dispose of, modify the use of, or change the terms of the real property title or other interest in the site and facilities without permission and instructions from the awarding agency; will record the Federal awarding agency directives; and will include a covenant in the title of real property acquired in whole or in part with Federal assistance funds to assure nondiscrimination during the useful life of the project.
- (b) Will comply with the requirements of the assistance awarding agency with regard to the drafting, review, and approval of construction plans and specifications.

1.3. Procurement.

1.4. Suspension and Debarment.

Pursuant to Executive Order 12549, as implemented at 2 CFR Parts 180 and 1200, prior to entering into a covered transaction with an applicant, FTA must determine whether the applicant is excluded from participating in covered non-procurement transactions. For this purpose, FTA is authorized to collect a certification from each applicant regarding the applicant's exclusion status. 2 CFR § 180.300. CATEGORY 2. PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION AGENCY SAFETY PLANS

This certification is required of each applicant under the Urbanized Area Formula Grants Program (49 U.S.C. § 5307), each rail operator that is subject to FTA's state safety oversight programs, and each State that is required to draft and certify a public transportation agency safety plan on behalf of a small public transportation provider pursuant to 49 CFR § 673.11 (d). This certification is required by 49 CFR § 673.13.

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(as that term is defined at 49 CFR § 673.5) and Board of Directors or Equivalent Authority (as that term is defined at 49 CFR § 673.5).

CATEGORY 3. TAX LIABILITY AND FELONY CONVICTIONS.

This certification is a material representation of fact upon which reliance was placed when this transaction was made or entered into. Submission of this certification is a prerequisite for making or entering into this transaction imposed by section 1352, title 31, U.S. Code. Any person who fails to file the required certification shall be subject to a civil penalty of not less than \$10,000 and not more than \$100,000 for each such failure.

4.2. Statement for Loan Guarantees and Loan Insurance.

The undersigned states, to the best of his or her knowledge and belief, that:

If any funds have been paid or will be paid to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection with this commitment providing for the United States to insure or guarantee a loan, the undersigned shall complete and submit Standard Form-LLL, "Disclosure Form to Report Lobbying," in accordance with its instructions.

Submission of this statement is a prerequisite for making or entering into this transaction imposed by section 1352, title 31, U.S. Code. Any person who fails to file the required statement shall be subject to a civil penalty of not less than \$10,000 and not more than \$100,000 for each such failure.

CATEGORY 5. PRIVATE SECTOR PROTECTIONS.

If the applicant will apply for funds that it will use to acquire or operate public transportation facilities or equipment, the applicant must make the following certification regarding protections for the private sector.

5.1. Charter Service Agreement.

To enforce the provisions of 49 US.C. § 5323(d), FTA's charter service regulation requires each applicant seeking assistance from FTA for the purpose of acquiring or operating any public transportation equipment or facilities to make the following Charter Service Agreement. 49 CFR § 604.4.

 - (1) The applicant agrees that neither it nor any operator of project equipment will engage in school bus operations in competition with private school bus operators except as provided herein.

 - (4) The applicant agrees that the project facilities and equipment shall be used for the provision of mass transportation services within its urban area and that any other

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use of project facilities and equipment will be incidental to and shall not interfere with the use of such facilities and equipment in mass transportation service to the public.

CATEGORY 6. TRANSIT ASSET MANAGEMENT PLAN.

If the applicant owns, operates, or manages capital assets used to provide public transportation, the following certification is required by 49 US.C. \S 5326(a).

The applicant certifies that it is in compliance with 49 CFR Part 625.

CATEGORY 7. ROLLING STOCK BUY AMERICA REVIEWS AND BUS TESTING.

7.1. Rolling Stock Buy America Reviews.

If the applicant will apply for an award to acquire rolling stock for use in revenue service, it must make this certification. This certification is required by 49 CFR \S 663. 7.

The applicant certifies that it will conduct or cause to be conducted the pre-award and post-delivery audits prescribed by 49 CFR Part 663 and will maintain on file the certifications required by Subparts B, C, and D of 49 CFR Part 663.

- (b) Has or will have satisfactory continuing control over the use of equipment and facilities;
- (c) Will maintain equipment and facilities in accordance with the applicant's transit asset management plan;
- (d) Will ensure that, during non-peak hours for transportation using or involving a facility or equipment of a project financed under this section, a fare that is not more than 50 percent of the peak hour fare will be charged for any-
 - (1) Senior;
 - (2) Individual who, because of illness, injury, age, congenital malfunction, or any other incapacity or temporary or permanent disability (including an individual who is a wheelchair user or has semi-ambulatory capability), cannot use a public transportation service or a public transportation facility effectively without special facilities, planning, or design; and
 - (3) Individual presenting a Medicare card issued to that individual under title II or XVIII of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. §§ 401 et seq., and 1395 et seq.);
- (e) In carrying out a procurement under 49 U.S.C. § 5307, will comply with 49 U.S.C. § 5323 (general provisions) and 5325 (contract requirements);
- (f) Has complied with 49 U.S.C. § 5307(b) (program of projects requirements);
- (g) Has available and will provide the required amounts as provided by 49 U.S.C. § 5307(d) (cost sharing);
- (h) Will comply with 49 U.S.C. §§ 5303 (metropolitan transportation planning) and 5304 (statewide and nonmetropolitan transportation planning);
- (i) Has a locally developed process to solicit and consider public comment before raising a fare or carrying out a major reduction of transportation;
- G) Either-
 - (1) Will expend for each fiscal year for public transportation security projects, including increased lighting in or adjacent to a public transportation system (including bus stops, subway stations, parking lots, and garages), increased camera surveillance of an area in or adjacent to that system, providing an emergency telephone line to contact law enforcement or security personnel in an area in or adjacent to that system, and any other project intended to increase the security and safety of an existing or planned public transportation system, at least

1 percent of the amount the recipient receives for each fiscal year under 49 U.S.C. § 5336; or

- (2) Has decided that the expenditure for security projects is not necessary;
- (k) In the case of an applicant for an urbanized area with a population of not fewer than 200,000 individuals, as determined by the Bureau of the Census, will submit an annual report listing projects carried out in the preceding fiscal year under 49 U.S.C. § 5307 for associated transit improvements as defined in 49 U.S.C. § 5302; and
- (1) Will comply with 49 U.S.C. § 5329(d) (public transportation agency safety plan).

CATEGORY 9. FORMULA GRANTS FOR RURAL AREAS.

If the applicant will applyforfunds made available to it under the Formula Grants for Rural Areas Program (49 U.S.C. § 5311), it must make this certification. Paragraph (a) of this certification helps FTA make the determinations required by 49 U.S.C. § 5310(b)(2)(C). Paragraph (b) of this certification is required by 49 U.S.C. § 5311(/)(2). Paragraph (c) of this certification, which applies to funds apportioned for the Appalachian Development Public Transportation Assistance Program, is necessary to enforce the conditions of 49 U.S.C. § 5311(c)(2)(D).

- (a) The applicant certifies that its State program for public transportation service projects, including agreements with private providers for public transportation service---

 - (2) Provides the maximum feasible coordination of public transportation service assisted under 49 U.S.C. § 5311 with transportation service assisted by other Federal sources; and
- (b) If the applicant will in any fiscal year expend less than 15% of the total amount made available to it under 49 U.S.C. § 5311 to carry out a program to develop and support intercity bus transportation, the applicant certifies that it has consulted with affected intercity bus service providers, and the intercity bus service needs of the State are being met adequately.
- (c) If the applicant will use for a highway project amounts that cannot be used for operating expenses authorized under 49 U.S.C. § 531 l(c)(2) (Appalachian Development Public Transportation Assistance Program), the applicant certifies that-
 - (1) It has approved the use in writing only after providing appropriate notice and an opportunity for comment and appeal to affected public transportation providers; and
 - (2) It has determined that otherwise eligible local transit needs are being addressed.

CATEGORY 10. FIXED GUIDEWAY CAPITAL INVESTMENT GRANTS AND THE EXPEDITED PROJECT DELIVERY FOR CAPITAL INVESTMENT GRANTS PILOT PROGRAM.

If the applicant will applyfor an award under any subsection of the Fixed Guideway Capital Investment Program (49 U.S.C. § 5309), including an award made pursuant to the FASTAct's Expedited Project Deliveryfor Capital Investment Grants Pilot Program (Pub. L. 114-94, div. A, title IIL § 3005(b)), the applicant must make the following certification. This certification is required by 49 U.S.C. § 5309(c)(2) and Pub. L. 114-94, div. A, title IIL § 3005(b)(3)(B).

The applicant certifies that it:

- (a) Has or will have the legal, financial, and technical capacity to carry out its Award, including the safety and security aspects of that Award,
- (b) Has or will have satisfactory continuing control over the use of equipment and facilities acquired or improved under its Award.
- (c) Will maintain equipment and facilities acquired or improved under its Award in accordance with its transit asset management plan; and
- (d) Will comply with 49 U.S.C. §§ 5303 (metropolitan transportation planning) and 5304 (statewide and nonmetropolitan transportation planning).

CATEGORY 11. GRANTS FOR BUSES AND BUS FACILITIES AND LOW OR NO EMISSION VEHICLE DEPLOYMENT GRANT PROGRAMS.

If the applicant is in an urbanized area and will apply for an award under subsection (a) (formula grants) or subsection (b) (competitive grants) of the Grants for Buses and Bus Facilities Program (49 U.S.C. § 5339), the applicant must make the certification in Category 8 for Urbanized Area Formula Grants (49 U.S.C. § 5307). This certification is required by 49 U.S.C. § 5339(a)(3) and (b)(6), respectively.

If the applicant is in a rural area and will apply for an award under subsection (a) (formula grants) or subsection (b) (competitive grants) of the Grants for Buses and Bus Facilities Program (49 U.S.C. § 5339), the applicant must make the certification in Category 9 for Formula Grants for Rural Areas (49 U.S.C. § 5311). This certification is required by 49 U.S.C. § 5339(a)(3) and (b)(6), respectively.

If the applicant, regardless of whether it is in an urbanized or rural area, will apply for an award under subsection (c) (low or no emission vehicle grants) of the Grants for Buses and Bus Facilities Program (49 U.S.C. § 5339), the applicant must make the certification in Category 8 for Urbanized Area Formula Grants (49 U.S.C. § 5307). This certification is required by 49 U.S.C. § 5339(c)(3).

Making this certification will incorporate by reference the applicable certifications in Category 8 or Category 9.

CATEGORY 12. ENHANCED MOBILITY OF SENIORS AND INDIVIDUALS WITH DISABILITIES PROGRAMS.

If the applicant will apply for an award under the Formula Grants for the Enhanced Mobility of Seniors and Individuals with Disabilities Program (49 U.S.C. § 5310), it must make the certification in Category 8 for Urbanized Area Formula Grants (49 U.S.C. § 5307). - (c) To the maximum extent feasible, the services funded under 49 U.S.C. § 5310 will be coordinated with transportation services assisted by other Federal departments and agencies, including any transportation activities carried out by a recipient of a grant from the Department of Health and Human Services; and
- (d) If the applicant will allocate funds received under 49 U.S.C. § 5310 to subrecipients, it will do so on a fair and equitable basis.

CATEGORY 13. STATE OF GOOD REPAIR GRANTS.

If the applicant will apply for an award under FTA's State of Good Repair Grants Program (49 U.S.C. § 5337), it must make the following certification. Because FTA generally does not review the transit asset management plans of public transportation providers, this certification is necessary to enforce the provisions of 49 U.S.C. § 5337(a)(4).

The applicant certifies that the projects it will carry out using assistance authorized by the State of Good Repair Grants Program, 49 U.S.C. § 5337, are aligned with the applicant's most recent

transit asset management plan and are identified in the investment and prioritization section of such plan, consistent with the requirements of 49 CFR Part 625.

CATEGORY 14. INFRASTRUCTURE FINANCE PROGRAMS.

If the applicant will apply for an award for a project that will include assistance under the Transportation Infrastructure Finance and Innovation Act ("TIFIA") Program (23 U.S. C. §§ 601-609) or the State Infrastructure Banks ("SIB") Program (23 U.S.C. § 610), it must make the certifications in Category 8 for the Urbanized Area Formula Grants Program, Category 10 for the Fixed Guideway Capital Investment Grants program, and Category 13 for the State of Good Repair Grants program. These certifications are required by 49 U.S.C. § 5323(0).

Making this certification will incorporate the certifications in Categories 8, 10, and 13 by reference.

CATEGORY 15. ALCOHOL AND CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES TESTING.

If the applicant will apply for an award under FTA's Urbanized Area Formula Grants Program (49 U.S.C. § 5307), Fixed Guideway Capital Investment Program (49 U.S.C. § 5309), Formula Grants for Rural Areas Program (49 U.S.C. § 5311), or Grants for Buses and Bus Facilities Program (49 U.S.C. § 5339) programs, the applicant must make the following certification. The applicant must make this certification on its own behalf and on behalf of its subrecipients and contractors. This certification is required by 49 CFR § 655.83.

The applicant certifies that it, its subrecipients, and its contractors are compliant with FTA's regulation for the Prevention of Alcohol Misuse and Prohibited Drug Use in Transit Operations, 49 CFR Part 655.

CATEGORY 16. RAIL SAFETY TRAINING AND OVERSIGHT.

If the applicant is a State with at least one railfvced guideway system, or is a State Safety Oversight Agency, or operates a railfixed guideway system, it must make thefollowing certification. The elements of this certification are required by 49 CFR §§ 659.43, 672.31, and 674.39.

The applicant certifies that the rail fixed guideway public transportation system and the State Safety Oversight Agency for the State are:

- (a) Compliant with the requirements of 49 CFR Part 659, "Rail Fixed Guideway Systems; State Safety Oversight";
- (b) Compliant with the requirements of 49 CFR Part 672, "Public Transportation Safety Certification Training Program"; and
- (c) Compliant with the requirements of 49 CFR Part 674, "Sate Safety Oversight".

CATEGORY 17. DEMAND RESPONSIVE SERVICE.

If the applicant operates demand responsive service and will apply for an award to purchase a non-rail vehicle that is not accessible within the meaning of 49 CFR Part 37, it must make the following certification. This certification is required by 49 CFR \S 37. 77.

The applicant certifies that the service it provides to individuals with disabilities is equivalent to that provided to other persons. If the applicant will payfor interest or otherfinancing costs of a project using assistance awarded under the Urbanized Area Formula Grants Program (49 U.S. C. § 5307), the Fixed Guideway Capital Investment Grants Program (49 U.S.C. § 5309), or any program that must comply with the requirements of 49 U.S.C. § 5307, including the Formula Grants for the Enhanced Mobility of Seniors Program (49 U.S.C. § 5310), "jlexfunds" from infrastructure programs administered by the Federal Highways Administration (see 49 U.S.C. § 5334(i)), or awards to urbanized areas under the Grants for Buses and Bus Facilities Program (49 U.S.C. § 5339), the applicant must make the following certification.  - (3) It will inform FTA promptly if its procurement system does not comply with either of those U.S. DOT regulations.
- (e) It will comply with the Certifications, Assurances, and Agreements in:
 - (1) Category 05.1 and 05.2 (Charter Service Agreement and School Bus Agreement),
 - (2) Category 06 (Transit Asset Management Plan),
