

WHAT IS THE CEDS?

A Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy or CEDS is more than just another plan. It is designed to bring regional economic development to the forefront by identifying regional and local economic development priorities established through an agreed upon plan of action. It is also an important prerequisite to receive designation as an Economic Development District by the federal Economic Development Agency, enabling the region and its communities to be eligible for funding of certain projects.

WHAT IS THE PLAN'S PURPOSE?

An important part of the CEDS development is to bring the public and private sectors together to review the regional economy, analyze and interpret pertinent data, with an eye towards developing recommendations that target investment priorities and projects that will strengthen the regional economy.

WHAT DOES THE CEDS ACCOMPLISH?

The CEDS identifies economic development priorities and provides a foundation for communities and the region to strategically identify funding opportunities. It builds on and supports other local and regional efforts and identifies key areas to focus economic development efforts. By looking at the competitive advantages of the region, aligning public and private investments, and using the best available data to provide stakeholders with sufficient information to make well-informed decisions, the CEDS can advance and increase the economic competitiveness of the region.

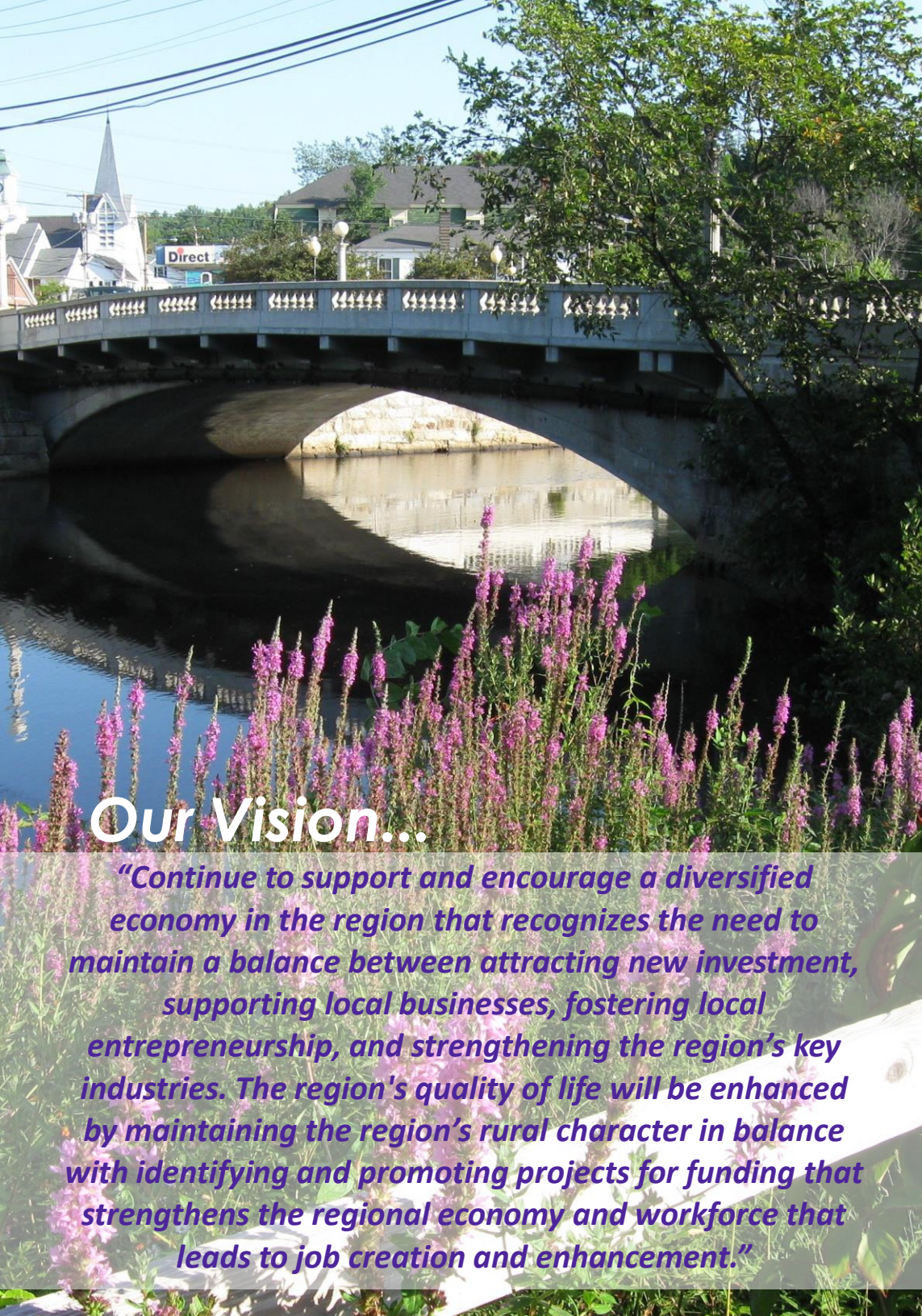

HOW WAS THE CEDS UPDATED?

In 2023, SNHPC and CNHRPC worked collaboratively to pull together economic development leaders, public officials, municipal staff, representatives of land use boards and economic development committees from the 26 communities within the boundary of the CEDS region. This group, the CEDS Strategy Committee, focused their efforts on nominating new CEDS projects to be included in the 2023 CEDS Project List Update.

A Project Selection Sub-Committee consisting of municipal representatives reviewed each project submission and ranked projects according to their Regional Economic Impact and Project Readiness. The new CEDS project list includes Economic Development projects ranging from strategic sewer and water infrastructure expansions to transportation infrastructure that will enable business development and job growth in the Central-Southern CEDS region.

After the ranking by the Project Selection Sub-Committee, the full project ranking list was brought to the CEDS Advisory Committee in July 2023. The projects are listed on the following pages and are sorted under the following categories: Education, Energy, Transportation, Sewer & Water, Studies Municipal, Recreation, and Other.
