1. Call to Order/Introductions

There was not an in-person quorum. A gathering of members present began at 9:36 AM.

2. Action on Minutes of June 16, 2022

Minutes were tabled due to lack of a quorum.

3.1 <u>COVID Traffic Trends in New Hampshire</u>

Dr. Salma Sultana and Mr. Stuart Thompson of NHDOT gave an overview of traffic trends since COVID, noting trends on a turnpike, principal arterial, and minor arterial. Volumes have nearly returned to normal on arterial roadways, but not quite on turnpikes/interstates. Dr. Sultana also said that PM peak volumes have spread out on weekdays, and now appear to occur earlier (i.e. 3-5pm vs. 4-6pm) than in pre-COVID times.

In response to a question from Mr. George Sioras, Dr. Sultana replied that recent gas price trends have not yet been analyzed comprehensively.

Mr. Thompson mentioned the desire to collect data on all paved roads by 2026; Mr. Nate Miller noted that SNHPC already collects data at many locations for its model and would be happy to share this with NHDOT.

3.2 <u>Clean Diesel Program Request for Proposals</u>

Ms. Jessica Wilcox gave an overview of the RFP, noting that the anticipated total amount of funding available is \$1.4 million. Applications for the first grant round are due on September 9, 2022. If funding remains, the second-round due date would be November 1, 2022, and a third round on January 1, 2023.

3.3 SADES Field Data Collection Solicitation

Mr. Ben Herbert gave an overview of the Statewide Asset Data Exchange System (SADES) program, and how SNHPC uses it to collect data on sidewalks, crosswalks, and curb ramps in the region. A pilot was recently completed in Auburn, and SNHPC may have funding available to perform a pilot in another town or towns.

4. Other Business

There was no other business.

The meeting stood adjourned at 10:35 am.
