Help shape New Hampshire's next Climate Action Plan!


New Hampshire has received federal grant funding to update its Climate Action Plan through the US Environmental Protection Agency's <u>Climate Pollution Reduction Grant</u> <u>program</u>. This winter, a series of collaborative community conversations will help identify priority strategies for reducing harmful air pollution and greenhouse gas emissions, while also supporting good jobs and lower energy costs.


