
### **Project for Public Spaces**

Human trafficking is an urgent social issue affecting people across the globe, in all 50 U.S. States, and in all 10 counties in New Hampshire. Though NH was one of the first states to criminalize human trafficking activity- the exploitation of a person through labor, services, or a commercial sex act by force, fraud, or coercion- the number of human trafficking cases in our state has increased in recent years.

### Merrimack Conservation Partnership Land Conservation Grant December 2023 now open

A **special round** for the Merrimack Conservation Partnership Land Conservation Grant program is now open to award funds that remained after the grant round held earlier this year. In this round, there is **\$11,300 available** for reimbursement of transaction expenses for qualifying land conservation projects.

The requirements for project eligibility are the same as they were for the Fall 2023 round, so projects that have already been completed in the 2023 calendar may be eligible for a grant in this round. Just remember that only eligible transaction costs incurred *after* December 31, 2022 may be reimbursed in this grant round. Please review the details in the grant RFP, which is attached along with the application.



## **Southern New Hampshire Planning Commission**





The SNHPC region includes the City of Manchester and the Towns of Auburn, Bedford, Candia, Chester, Deerfield, Derry, Francestown, Goffstown, Hooksett, Londonderry, New Boston, Weare and Windham.

The main functions of SNHPC are to increase communication; promote intergovernmental cooperation and coordination between planning boards and local officials; promote coordinated development of the region; prepare and adopt regional plans, including policies and strategies for the region; and perform other acts or functions as deemed appropriate to fulfill its duties.

SNHPC is governed by a Board of Commissioners, approximately 48 local representatives from our 14 member communities. The Commissioners are appointed by the governing bodies of the member municipalities upon the recommendation of their respective planning boards, as outlined in RSA 36:46. An Executive Committee, consisting of 14 commissioners, is elected from the membership of the full Board of Commissioners to provide overall policy directions and guidance, and to administer the Commissions' financial and operational affairs. An Executive Director is appointed by the Commission to manage and supervise the day-to-day operations of the Commision and its staff under the general direction provided by the Executive Committee and the Board of Commissioners.
