#### CALL TO ORDER

Chair Griffin called the MPO meeting to order at 11:31 AM. A quorum was present in-person.

#### **ACTION ON MINUTES OF JUNE 28, 2022**

Motion by Mr. Tripp to approve the minutes of June 28, 2022, seconded by Mr. Jean. Motion carried, with Messrs. Cartier, O'Connor, Renauld-Smith and Ms. Vadney abstaining. Vote taken by roll call.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

#### Clean Diesel (DERA) Grant Program

Ricky DiCillo, NHDES Grants Coordinator, provided an overview of the FY22 Program. Mr. DiCillo noted the following in his presentation:

- This is a matching program.
- The funding is for replacing a diesel unit with one with fewer emissions or upgrading/installing idle reducing technology.
- The program is applicable to most fleets and owners.
- The first round of proposals is due 9/9/22 by 4:00pm with project completion by 9/30/23. Mr. DiCillo noted this includes marine engines and locomotives.
- The funding comes from EPA. The State supplements the federal resources with Volkswagen settlement funds, and last year's remaining funds are being rolled over into this year.
- Plug-in systems which allow heat/air conditioning to run while parked are also eligible.

Mr. DiCillo provided some examples and restrictions. Vehicles have to be Class 5 and above, from 2009 or older, and the old engines must be destroyed or scrapped for salvage metal.

Mr. DiCillo advised that proposals are evaluated based on the cost effectiveness of emission reductions. He noted there will be a webinar on August 9<sup>th</sup> with more information.

Mr. DiCillo also explained there will be three rounds if funds remain. He mentioned the grant awards require Governor and Council approval.

NHDES' Jessica Wilcox, who is part of the Granite State Clean Cities Coalition, is another great resource for potential grant applicants.

In response to a question from Mr. Tripp regarding the plug-ins for AC or heat, Mr. DiCillo advised the responsible party could be the owner.

Mr. Tripp also inquired if the program will pay for a private electric truck. Mr. DiCillo said it's possible if it's for a business, agency or municipality and replaces an eligible older vehicle.

There was a question about "drayage." Drayage refers to the first portion (or "first mile") of the transportation of freight from a port to a destination. Drayage generally involves trucking between different intermodal freight facilities.

Mr. Schnakenberg inquired if Mr. DiCillo is presenting at other RPCs. He confirmed that he was.

Mr. DiCillo was thanked for his presentation.

## **Other Business**

Mr. Miller stated there will be an NHDOT Public Meeting in Derry on August 4, 2022 from 6:00-7:00 pm regarding Exit 4A.
