
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

Figure 3: Regional Growth








Figure 5: Older Adult Growth in the SNHPC Region








Figure 7: Refugees by City of Resettlement










Figure 8.1.A: NH Homeless Population (Point of Time Counts)



Figure 9: Equity Area












Figure 10: SNHPC Active Property Listings (12-Month Moving Average)






Figure 11.1.A: SNHPC Real Median Purchase Price (12-Month Moving Average)







Figure 11.1.D: NH Average Number of Days a Home Is on the Market Before It Sells (12-Month Moving Average)









Figure 11.1.F: NH Active Property Listings (12-Month Moving Average)






Figure 11.2.B: US 30-Year Fixed Rate Mortgage Average Annualized Growth Rate




Figure 14: Percentage of Households by Area Median Income (AMI) in the SNHPC Region









Figure 17: New Hampshire's Population Growth Over Time



Figure 18.1.B: Regional Planning Commissions Net Population Growth 2020 to 2050












Figure 21: Title VI/EJ Population Concentrations for SNHPC Census Tracts

Figure 21.1.B: Exclusionary Zoning & Minority Segregation: Manchester, NH






Figure 22: Average Property Value by Acreage Decile for SNHPC Single-Family Homes











Figure 23: Derry Single-Family Homes: Value per Acre





Figure 25: Cost Burdened Households





Figure 25.1.A: Cost Burdened Households












Figure 25.2.B: The Real Cost of Gas (January 2000 to November 2022)

Figure 26: How Transportation Decisions Drive Land Use











#### Figure 21.1.B: SNHPC Properties within 500 Feet of Both Water & Sewer Service


