It's challenging, right? There's dozens of services available throughout the region, many of which provide rides for medical appointments, grocery shopping, and other essential errands. Information on this needs to be





This past May, I had the opportunity to spend four days in Oklahoma City to attend the 2023 Community Transportation Assosciation of America Expo. At the expo, I met lots of mobility managers from around the country and learned about the work they're doing to help their community. Now that I'm back in the Granite State, I figured I would share with you all the exciting programs happening around the county.

COMMUNITY TRANSPORTATION NAVIGATORS IN KING COUNTY, WA



The King County Mobility Coalition (KCMC) developed the Community Transportation Navigators (CTN) project to help provide transportation information to hard-to-reach communities. The first CTN program is heavily involved with the region's Filipino community. People who have limited English-speaking abilities often struggle to navigate transportation services. In response to this, community

transportation navigators built connections with members of the Filipino community. Navigators host outreach events to directly engage community members. They provide a variety of support and creative solutions to meet the needs of their represented communities.

KANSAS MOBILITY WEEK



The state of Kansas recently launched Mobility Week to celebrate making smart, efficient, and safe multimodal community transportation choices. Cities, counties, and providers promote transportation, highlight achievements, and

introduce new initiatives and policies. In 2022, 37 counties participated in Mobility Week with 55 events throughout the state. These included free rides to events, such as to and from voting sites as well as free rides for veterans on Veteran's Day. Mobility Week also featured a selfie challenge. Participants took photos of themselves using community transportation, then posted them to social media using the hashtag #KansasRides2022. Six winners were chosen at random and received \$25 gift cards.

SCHUYLER COUNTY TRANSIT LINK-LINE



Schuyler county is a rural county located in central New York. They have their own transit service which provides fixed-route, demand-response, and paratransit services. Schuyler County Transit also provides a service called Transportation Link-Line.

This is a free information and assistance service that connects people in Schuyler County and neighboring communities with transportation options. They also provide public outreach, transit orientation and answers questions regarding transportation options. These options include public transit, volunteer driver programs, car pool options, and trip planning.

This past month, I had the opportunity to participate in a listening session to learn about elders' experiences growing older in New Hampshire. The event was organized by the NH Alliance for Healthy Aging, and hosted by Victory Women of Vision in Manchester. The event was jam-packed with dancing, delicious food, and most importantly, insights on the experience of aging in New Hampshire. Below are the five questions we asked them, and the responses they gave.

WHAT IS WORKING WELL IN YOUR COMMUNITY AS IT RELATES TO AGING?

- Help and support from neighbors and family members.
- Community organizations like Meals on Wheels and Victory Women of Vision
- "Nothing" was the overwhelming response.

WHAT IS NOT WORKING WELL IN YOUR COMMUNITY AS IT RELATES TO AGING?

- The lack of healthcare services checking in on those in need. Some
 participants emphasized that an initial attempt was made to service providers
 and it didn't not go well. They lost confidence in the system and no further
 contact was attempted.
- Elders are unaware of the services provided or the resources that are available, like assistance with walkers or wheelchairs, transportation programs, and other services.
- Getting to know about services seemed overwhelming, too complicated, or just not worth the effort. They also feel embarrassed asking for help.
- Getting to know neighbors seemed to be a struggle for some. Their neighborhoods are lacking a sense of community.

HOW CAN NH BETTER SERVE AND SUPPORT ITS AGING POPULATION TODAY AND IN THE FUTURE?

- Agencies need to understand the needs of elders, and they need to listen to elders when they share their needs.
- More informative events to better learn about available resources.
- Providers, senior centers, and agencies need to have creative outreach opportunities for elders.
- More assistance with transportation is needed. One woman admitted she could still drive but knew the time was coming when she would no longer be able to drive and wasn't sure what would happen then.
- More senior housing is needed.
- Better in-home assistance for elders is needed so that they can age in place.

WHAT DO YOU NEED TO CONTINUE LIVING IN YOUR HOME AS YOU GET OLDER?

- Adult day care center. One participant is a caretaker for her elderly mother
 who needs round the clock supervision. She wants her mother to be able to
 stay home while she works or go to an adult day care center. The care needed
 for her mother was at times overwhelming, and she was unaware of many of
 the services available including 211, Service link, transportation services, Cashin
 Center's programs, etc.
- In-home services including Meals-on-Wheels and information on how to sign up for services.
- More security for multi-family senior housing.

WHAT CAN WE DO TO REDUCE ISOLATION FOR OLDER ADULTS IN NH?

- More translation for informational resources.
- More events like this listening session.
- More transportation. All participants knew someone who couldn't attend this event due to transportation.
- More support programs.


