

# RIDING WITH VICTORY WOMEN OF VISION

This December, NH Alliance for Healthy Aging, SNHPC, and I partnered with Manchester Transit Authority to offer Victory Women of Vision a tour of the Green DASH, MTA's free downtown shuttle. Victory Women of Vision (VWV) is an organization in downtown Manchester that offers community support to elderly



immigrant/refugee women. The goal of the tour was to show how participants could independently navigate the city using public transit, starting with the Green DASH. Utilizing this free service, the thought was to show community connections to potential new riders from VWV. While it was great doing the tour with staff and VWV members, there were lessons learned regarding mobility and language challenges older adults and non-English speakers face navigating transit systems. For starters, a 5 minute walk to the bus stop was 15 minutes for those with mobility issues, which was particularly difficult on a cold December day. Also, the group was a diverse mix of backgrounds, with members speaking French, Albanian, and Arabic. Translated transit information was provided, but language barriers can still be intimidating for potential riders. Thankfully, the wonderful staff at MTA took the extra steps to accommodate the riders. In short, meeting transportation needs goes beyond simply offering service, but also bridging language and mobility gaps.







