BACKGROUND


- Collaborative Economic Development Region (CEDR)
 - NH Department of Business and Economic Affairs (NH BEA) initiative to better support and connect with regional economic development stakeholders across the state
 - Provided funding for CNHRPC and SNHPC to update the Central-Southern CEDS Project List

WHAT IS A CEDS?

- Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy
- A strategic roadmap or action plan for regional economic development
- A "project list" and goals and objectives make up the heart of the CEDS plan
- Benefits of having a CEDS include:
 - Identifying regional industry clusters
 - Assessing region's SWOTs
 - Help make the case for funding regional projects
 - Engage collaboration between communities

CENTRAL-SOUTHERN CEDS

- 26 municipalities and two counties – 21 towns in Merrimack County and 5 towns in Hillsborough County
- 6 towns/cities are part of the SNHPC Region
- Last Updated in 2019
- CEDS should be updated in 2024



- CEDS Strategy Committee
 - Economic development leaders
 - Public officials
 - Municipal staff
 - Representatives of land use boards and economic development committees



- Not a full CEDS update
- Municipalities nominated economic development projects
- Project Selection Sub-Committee reviewed 60 project nomination forms
- The updated CEDS project list includes Economic Development projects ranging from strategic sewer and water infrastructure expansions to transportation infrastructure that will enable business development and job growth in the Central-Southern CEDS region.
