

What is a Parklet?

- A Parklet is a removable platform that is seasonally installed in a parking space that is closed to motor vehicle parking
- Parklets offer amenities that allow people to stop, sit & enjoy neighborhood street life, creating new public spaces and enhancing quality of life
- Activates public space, provides opportunities for existing and new restaurants and stimulates outdoor dining experiences

What are the Guidelines?

- Design and location are considered on a case-by-case basis and must be safe and appropriate, meeting approved design standards
- If parklet is proposed to support an existing business, the business is responsible for all expenses, maintenance and operation of the parklet
- On streets where speed limit exceeds 25 mph, approval is case-by-case
- Parklets must be at least one space away from corner and will be sited along curb line. Parklets must not block active driveways and walkways, utilities or fire hydrants




- How should parklet be built?
