How we Count Pedestrians




- PYRO-Box counts all pedestrians (cyclists, walkers, runners etc.)
- Uses infrared technology and a high-precision lens to detect people by their body temperature
- Can detect two or more people walking together
- Detects the direction in which people are walking or riding
- Works in all weather conditions






